Established in 2020, the Committee ensures that our work remains rooted in the lived experiences of Ontario's diverse HIV community.

Eligibility

Applicants must:

- Be living with HIV and currently residing in Ontario
- Be at least 18 years old
- Be a graduate of the Positive Leadership Development Institute (PLDI) core training or another recognized capacity-building program delivered in Ontario
- Be endorsed by an OAN member or affiliate organization
- Be willing to serve a 2-year term and attend regular scheduled Zoom meetings bi monthly *****

Who Should Apply

We are committed to reflecting the full diversity of people living with HIV in Ontario. We strongly encourage applications from individuals with a variety of lived experiences, including but not limited to:

- African, Caribbean & Black communities
- Cis and trans women
- 2Spirit and Indigenous people
- Gay, bisexual, and other men who have sex with men
- South-East and South Asian communities
- Gender diverse, non-binary, and intersex individuals
- LatinX, Middle Eastern, and newcomer communities
- Youth, international students, and long-term survivors
- People who use drugs
- People who have experienced incarceration
- People who are aging with HIV
- People who are newly diagnosed



What You'll Do

- Guide the development and launch of Living and Serving, including the Ontario Accord
- Identify issues affecting people living with HIV across Ontario and inform OAN's response through community engagement
- Review and advise on implementation priorities from the 2017 Renovation Report
- Provide input on the delivery and expansion of the PLDI Ontario program, when requested
- Support the implementation and monitoring of meaningful engagement frameworks (MEPA) and biannual updates to the Ontario Accord
- Appoint 3–4 members to the Honor Roll Selection Committee
- Take on additional responsibilities as determined by the OAN
